Dear Parents/Carers,

As you will no doubt be aware, Key Stage 2 SATS are fast approaching and we just wanted to update you on the arrangements for the week. The assessments will take place on the following dates:

Monday 8.5.17	Reading
Tuesday 9.5.17	Spelling Punctuation & Grammar
Wednesday 10.5.17	Maths 1 – Arithmetic Maths 2 – Reasoning
Thursday 11.5.17	Maths 3 – Reasoning

We would like children to attend breakfast club – free of charge for Year 6 children – during SATS week so we can ensure they are settled and happy ahead of the morning's assessments. Breakfast club begins at 8:00 am each morning. Once breakfast club is finished, children will go to their classrooms for registration before the SATS. Should there be any issues with children feeling ill on those days, please inform school as soon as possible so that alternative provisions can be made.

SATS will be undertaken across different rooms in school to ensure all children get the conditions that they need to achieve their best. Some children will work in small-group situations to ensure that adults can provide support with reading questions as appropriate. If children would like to bring a small mascot or a photo for reassurance, this is acceptable.


